The Bible is No Ordinary Book!

Christians have been known to be "people of the book," and that book, of course is the Bible. Yet the Bible is not just one book. It is actually sixty-six books joined together into the Old and New Testaments. The Bible tells us how the world was created by the one true God—a Being of limitless power and love, and how God will fix the disobedience of His people through Jesus Christ. Around forty-five different people wrote the sixty-six books of the Bible—but each of these people had one thing in common. They were inspired to write every word by God Himself. As 1st Peter 1:21 says, the words in this book did not have their "...origin in the human will, but prophets, though human, spoke from God as they were carried along by the Holy Spirit." This is God's book, and God is the Author. The writers God used were indeed very different individuals. There were Kings like David and Solomon, prophets like Isaiah and Jeremiah, farmers like Amos, fishermen like Peter and John. Luke was a physician. Paul was a Pharisee. There was even a tax collector named Matthew. Most of the people God used to write His book didn't know each other—they couldn't because the Bible was written across a period of 1500 years—and in places all the way from Babylon to Rome, but their writings center around the same theme—God's redemptive plan. The Bible is like a puzzle where each piece is made by a different person independent of the other piecemakers, but they all fit to form a beautiful picture because each writer was inspired by the same source- God through His Holy Spirit. As it says in 2nd Timothy 3, "All Scripture is GOD-BREATHED." It's obviously NOT just a book, it is a gift from God to us, and we can thank God by reading it!

- 1. Approved Richard Oakes as Clerk of Session, Ryan Strawbridge as Assistant Clerk of Session, and Mark Vemer as Church Treasurer.
- 2. Corrected minutes from the March 2023 Session Meeting as follows: Under the Endowment Committee Report, the amount allocated to undesignated benevolences should be \$4,550 instead of \$2,550 and the amount allocated to Palmer Home should be \$385 instead of \$365.
- 3. Dr. Chaney has made the following recommendations for committee chairs for 2023-2024: Clerk of Session - Richard Oakes; Assistant Clerk of Session -Ryan Strawbridge; Building and Grounds: Jimmy Lott - Chair, Jim Bowen - Vice Chair; Christian Education: Sherry Clark - Chair, Pat Gulledge & Dallas Baker, Vice Chairs; Kindergarten Board: Cathy Jennings - Chair, Mary Haley Flautt - Vice Chair; Staff Support: Chuck Conditt - Chair, Richard Oakes - Vice Chair; Stewardship and Finance: Moss Melton -Chair, - Ryan Strawbridge - Vice Chair; Witness Committee: Todd Fincher - Chair, John Stewart -Vice Chair; Worship and Music Committee: Susan Beckham - Chair, Reese Pillow- Vice Chair; Youth Committee: Taylor Calhoun - Chair, Alan Barger - Vice Chair; Church Security: Miller King - Chair.
- Approved the payment of \$10,000 to the Community Food Pantry and \$5,000 to the Community Kitchen. The funds will come from 2021 Endowment Fund income that was reported to the Session at the March 2022 meeting. \$7,425 remains for allocation.
- 5. Approved allocating the \$22,848.00 approved for the Outreach Foundation in the 2023 budget for each of the following receiving \$5,712: Bettye and Bill Bryant Nursery, Yucatan Cistern Project, San Pablo Presbyterian Seminary in Yucatan, and Ukraine Seminary.
- 6. Approved \$36,364.88 from the Scott Fund to be used for 2023 mission trips.
- 7. Approved the payment of the \$2,950.00 collected for tornado relief following the March 24, 2023, tornadoes, to Mercy Chefs, a program that fed victims and first responders in Rolling Fork.
- Approved the following payments recommended by the Endowment Committee in its report to the Session at the March 2023 meeting: \$7,500.00 from the McKinnon Fund to the Outreach Foundation; \$2,438.00 to the Community Kitchen from the Local Benevolence allocation; \$2,000.00 to the Community Food Pantry and \$2,550.00 to the Community Kitchen from the Undesignated Benevolences allocation.
- Approved the transfer of the \$1,639.00 allocated for Capital Improvements by the Endowment Committee in its March 2023 report to the Session to the Building and Grounds Committee.
